RVTTC Update

July of this year (with WSAVA and CVMA conferences) RVTTC BoD will be meeting for board training and strategic planning in Toronto.

February was the launch RVT Talk E-newsletter for Canadian RVTs. This newsletter is sent out monthly and contains information from each Provincial RVT Association, updates from other animal health organisations, and occasionally contests and CE. Appreciate any feedback on the RVT Talk newsletter.

A committee is currently working on an RVT Career Ladder, which will provide information and options on career advancement within the RVT profession. The goal of this project is support career longevity for our members. This report will look at both specialty and non-specialty pathways.

The RVTTC has a representative who just attended the International Veterinary Nurse and Technicians Association conference. This year the IVNTA conference was held in Australia. The IVNTA is a federation of national veterinary nurse / technician associations. They seek to foster and promote links with veterinary nursing / technician staff worldwide. They aim to raise the international profile of veterinary nurses and technicians, and raise the standard of veterinary nurses and technicians internationally.

The RVTTC has partnered with the CVMA to provide members with professional liability coverage through the CVMA insurance program. CVBC Liaison Report

July 2018 – Luisa (CVBC registrar) said there would be no progress on bylaws until after January 2019.

BCVTA emailed the MoA and did not hear back until we emailed three more times. In February we did hear back, and set a meeting at the end of February.

At the meeting, Heather and Kirsten expressed concerns regarding working with CVBC Discussed creating a College of Veterinary Technologist, this is not viable on our end – we do not have a large enough membership or the finances to support this MoA recommended contacting CVBC and stating exactly what we want to happen & noted that we do not have to accept whatever the reply may be.

In Late February we received an email from Luisa CVBC stating she had begun working on bylaws and the CVBC had come up with a "fee schedule" for application and annual certification fees for techs. She stated CVBC registrants would be voting on it at their May 2019 meeting.

Fee structure was not terribly concerning to us, however the fact the CVBC wanted this in place before the bylaws was, so we sent a letter March 11th as a reply, which Kirsten read to those in attendance. (attached as addendum). CVBC's reply to our letter also attached as addendum.

We didn't get the answer we were looking for regarding bylaws, so we set a meeting with our lawyer to discuss what was in the best interest of our members. He is currently drafting a letter on our behalf stating we would like to see bylaws before we discuss a fee structure.

A member asked regarding fee schedule – just because CVBC puts a fee schedule in place, would we have to pay it? - not at this time.

Comments from the floor:

- Alberta restricts certain duties to RVTs
- Saskatchewan has a bylaw veterinarians cannot teach veterinary medicine to lay people
