Confused about the difference between CE "Activities"? You're not alone! CE submissions are often submitted without the education

activity selected or with the incorrect activity selected. Here is an easy way to know the difference:

- 1. "Education Activities" focus on structured learning experiences that enhance a professional's knowledge and skills within their field. These activities are usually instructor-led, content-rich, and designed with clear learning objectives. These activities are typically verified through certificates of completion, attendance logs, or transcripts, and must be relevant to the participant's area of professional practice.
 - Examples of Education Activities include veterinary technology program graduation, successful completion of a specialty certification, webinars, workshops, and conferences.
- 2. "Outreach and Volunteer Activities" emphasize community engagement and the application of professional expertise outside the traditional work environment. These experiences not only contribute to the public good but also enhance communication, leadership, and real-world application of professional knowledge.
 - Examples of Outreach/Volunteer Activities include BCVTA committee member service, volunteer work with animal welfare organizations such as SPCA, and participation with animal wellness projects such as the Canadian Animal Assistance Team, Veterinarians Without Boarders, Spay Neuter Cruiser.


